What we do...

The goal of METERS is to produce trained operators, following the guidelines set forth by the American Radio Relay League (ARRL), of which METERS Inc. is an affiliated organization.

METERS members consistently train on emergency communications procedures, utilizing the American Radio Relay League's "EmComm" Courses, which are part of the League's Certification & Continuing Education Program. Other training topics have included courses offered by the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, regarding Incident Command Procedures, and hazardous weather spotter training from the National Weather Service... just to name a few!







How YOU can participate?

If you are already a HAM radio operator, the next step is simple. Join METERS, Inc. Any current member of METERS can show you how. Then, you will need to equip yourself for an emergency. It could be as simple as owning an HT, along with some accessories and extra batteries... or as complex as owning a mobile rig in your vehicle with band specific antennas. You can learn more at a METERS meeting, where members routinely display & demonstrate emergency rigs. You could also tune into one of our training nets, to see how simple and enjoyable emergency communications can be, through the use of Amateur Radio. Through METERS you will learn the basics of the Incident Command System, how it works, and why it is important. You will also learn how to prepare yourself & your equipment for emergencies, and how to prepare your family for emergencies as well.

If you're NOT an amateur radio operator, but have an interest in emergency communications, then METERS can help there too! METERS routinely offers basic HAM Radio classes to help you study for the entry-level amateur test. This is the first step in getting you officially licensed by the FCC as an Amateur Radio Operator.
